Letters from Out

n the middle of the first century there was a man named Saul who lived out a radically transformed life. He was the chief persecutor of the church who became the chief architect of the church. He sought righteousness through works, yet began to teach that righteousness comes through faith alone. He moved from abhorring Gentiles to advocating for their place among God's people. He pursued status and power but came to embrace weakness, persecution, hunger, and imprisonment.

What happened? He encountered the resurrected Jesus. We learn about this encounter in the book of Acts. He began to go by the name Paul and went on to write 13 letters that would appear in the New Testament. It is in these letters that we hear Paul's call for all people to place their faith in Jesus and experience the ultimate transformation from death to life.
