COMMUNION PERSPECTIVE

Over the centuries the Church has developed different practices for the taking of communion. Different modes help believers reflect different characteristics of Jesus' presence and work in the world.

When we pass the communion elements among the congregation, it symbolizes Jesus' presence in the midst of our worshipping congregation. He is present and at work right where you sit. You don't need to go anywhere to experience Him; Jesus meets you where you are.

When we come forward for communion, it symbolizes Jesus' calling us out from where we are to a new place, where we meet Him apart from our normal routines and rhythms. Sometimes God asks us to break out of a pattern so we might hear Him speak more clearly. This method of communion is called Intinction. We will celebrate the Lord's Supper in this manner today. Please come forward and break a substantive piece of bread from the main loaf and dip it into the cup. In this way you will partake of both communion elements together.

At the Chapel, we honor both of these approaches to communion. We hope that by practicing each of them at different times of the year, we gain a fuller perspective on the God who loves us so much that He pursues us where we are and refuses to allow us to stay there.
